Automatic Admission Operating Guidelines

The University of Hawai'i System contains community colleges and four-year campuses, which allow students to attain their educational goals via multiple paths. The Automatic Admission program provides UH Community College (UHCC) students in Associate of Arts (AA) and select Associate of Science (AS) programs one path of seamless transfer to a four-year campus.

In 2009, the Automatic Admission program was created by UH Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, Reed Dasenbrock, as a way to encourage more UHCC students to transfer to a four-year campus, and the project was initiated for admission in 2007. The goal was to increase transfer students from the UHCCs to the four-year campuses by removing what students may view as transfer barriers. Eligible students are notified of their "automatic admission" to one of the four-year campuses via STAR. Students who elect this offer of admission do not have to complete another System Application Form to a four-year campus, will have their application fee waived and given priority registration at the four-year campus over non-Automatic Admission transfer students.
